PWRDF - Voices of Hope

Three-year-old Henry just wanted to run. He was participating in the summer camp organized by On Eagles' Wings in Fort McMurray, designed to assist children in healing from the trauma of the wildfire that forced mass evacuation in May 2016. To make the camps as accessible as possible, they operated as a drop-in and with no fee, thanks to funding from PWRDF.

Under the kind and attentive wing of volunteer Cam, a change slowly came over Henry. With Cam by his side, Henry was able to participate in more activities. Gradually the toy room became less attractive. Cam's gentle presence was calming Henry. The last day of camp featured a craft marathon, and staff expected Henry to play outdoors most of the afternoon. They were amazed to see Henry, with Cam by his side to steady and guide him, spend over an hour making flip-flops to walk with Jesus. He made hearts of love and painted a rock with a picture of his favourite Bible story.

PWRDF funds have contributed to other healing activities in Fort McMurray, such as a new community garden where a vacant lot once stood, and a music studio for youth.

What is the Anglican Foundation?

The Anglican Foundation of Canada was established in 1957 to encourage and support ministry within the Anglican Church of Canada where the need was greatest.

The Foundation has provided support through loans and grants for a vast array of infrastructure projects, such as church and rectory renovations, washroom and kitchen installations, and accessibility improvements. The Foundation's funding program also supports theological education and innovative ministry projects.

In 2017, the Anglican Foundation celebrated 60 years of supporting ministry in the Canadian Church. There are twelve board directors from across the country who make decisions regarding grants, exercise financial oversight, and set the strategic direction. The board is chaired by the Most Rev. Fred Hiltz, Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada, and the day-to-day operations are managed by Executive Director Judy Rois.
