#### How do we look?

There are several reasons we do a head count. The first is to know how many people we are ministering to throughout the week. This is why we do an average weekly attendance (excluding funerals and weddings), as opposed to a Sunday service count. Some congregations may have their largest service at another

point in the week. And this way shut-ins and fresh expressions are included as well.

Second, this outlines where time is being spent by the clergy and lay leadership. If there are lots of funerals, then pastoral care is central at that time. If there are lots of baptisms and confirmations, growing disciples is where the energy is being spent. Both are totally valid, the numbers help paint a picture.

Third, there are governance issues. How many people are sent to Diocesan Synod and General Synod for example. As there are a number of congregations with less than 10 for a weekly average, this means that they are not entitled to a Synod Delegate. While we are looking at changing the Canon, without the completed forms it is difficult to say if the congregation is active.

#### More than knees and nickels

The most important aspect is these numbers tell us about the health of a congregation. From this information the correct resources can be found for each congregations needs. While it may seem minor, these forms are important!
